



Fun Packed 4 Day Touring Package



This is a 4 day touring package for an example, days can be added and also some activities can be added

Day 1

Your tour guide will collect you all at the Cape Town International Airport. Depending on your arrival time, we can decide what you like to do – maybe some time to relax and enjoy the day from your long flights. This can be best done at the Waterfront, where your 4-star hotel is located. Here you can walk around independently as the whole Waterfront is 100 percent safe. Also, there are many restaurants to choose from for a lovely first dinner in Cape Town.

Day 2

After your breakfast you will be collected at the hotel and we do our very special Peninsula tour of Cape Town surroundings; On this trip, you will visit Table Mountain and also travel up to the top of Table Mountain by cable cart - this is a great experience and one of the important things one must do when in Cape Town. From here we will travel through Camps Bay beach, where the rich and famous stay. Then we move onto visiting Hout Bay and Marina Wharf where you can take a ferry to Seal Island - over 5000 seals live there! As this is optional, you can also only shop around and see our local curiosities. From here we travel to Chapman's Peak drive, one of the famous scenic drives around Cape Town. Next stop: Cape Point, our most Southerly Point of Africa. From there we go to Boulders beach near Simon's Town, famed to the oldest Naval base and fame to our very own African penguins. Muizenberg beach, where the famous battle of Muizenburg in 1700 took place, is next on our list. On the way back on the M5 towards Cape Town, we will see the famous hospital of the very first open-heart operation that was done by Prof. Chris Barnard. We then take you back to your hotel. This is a full day with lots of activities to see and do.

Day 3



After breakfast we travel to our famous wine region. We have 7 big wine regions in Cape Town area and we will visit 3 of the famous and also oldest wine regions: Stellenbosch, Paarl and Franschhoek. Here you will have the opportunity to taste some white and red wines. Part of this you will experience will also be eating different flavors of goat cheese and taste different types of pure chocolate from all over the world: www.spiceroute.co.za

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We also have the opportunity to visit the biggest private collection of cars from vintage to modern; if you like to do this it, is optional (view www.fmm.co.za). If you like, we can visit a cheetah farm where you can touch and interact with them for photos. We will then visit Franschhoek, a place where our French Huguenots settled. We take a walk around and shop at this beautiful place. Also, we will visit the famous wine estate www.cabriere.co.za in Franschhoek. This is full day of activities!



Day 4

After Breakfast we will travel up the West Coast along the Atlantic coast. Here you see many little sea villages along the coast. We will travel about an hour until we reach a place for our San people (bushmen), the first people to be seen in the Cape when the first settlers landed in 1652. These people were hunters and gatherers, we will be able to meet these people and learn how they have survived in the bush.

A small tour will be conducted for you, a very nice experience to hear them explain their culture and talk to them. View <http://www.khwattu.org/> for more information. From here we will travel through the West Coast National Park to get into a small town called Langebaan, fame for its fishing and the bird life in the lagoon – and also known for our best fighting corps who were trained in this area. From here we travel a short distance to an open seafood restaurant on the beach. Here you will experience a special culture which only can be seen in the Cape and nowhere else in the world: seafood is cooked on open fire and fresh homemade bread is served; no knife or fork, all meals are eaten from mussel shells. It is one awesome experience to eat a 10-course meal this way until you drop. This will take us almost to the late afternoon, when we will have to return to Cape Town (this activity is depending on the weather, otherwise we have alternative seafood restaurant in Langebaan). Full day of activities, as you see!





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Day 5

Along the rugged coast, scenic drives slice into mountains that plunge to the sea, penguins waddle on pristine beaches, and Cape Point is part of a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** with one of the richest floral kingdoms in the world.




